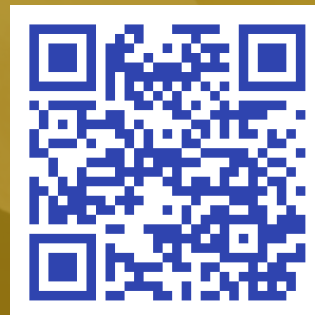
ABOUT THE SUMMER OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (OHIP)

- **Funded by the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), OHIP is a full time, paid summer internship** helping young people learn about the field of occupational safety and health from workers and their employers.
- **OHIP trains future leaders to ensure America's workplaces are safe.**

OHIP PROJECT EXAMPLES

- **Elijah worked with a local group to interview caregivers at residential facilities in Santa Clara County to better understand their working conditions**, results that will be shared with the County to make improvements.
- Other interns work on similar projects around the country. For example:
 - **Reducing exposures to chemicals** for maintenance workers
 - **Ensuring access to the right protective gear** for workers in sawmills & construction jobs
 - **Helping standardize engineering controls** by working with employers & contractors
